Palmyra and the Mediterranean

The conference Palmyra and the Mediterranean takes place within the framework of the collective research project "The Palmyra Portrait Project" financed by the Carlsberg Foundation. The conference is the second conference held within the project. Whereas the first conference The World of Palmyra focused on Palmyra's archaeology and history in general in order to provide a setting within which the portraiture in the Roman period could be contextualized, the scope of this conference is to explore the city's connections westward, namely the Mediterranean region, in the broadest sense.

Over the last years the Mediterranean has been conceptualized in the context of area studies and an important aspect to address is its reciprocal relation to extra-Mediterranean areas. Topics to be explored include Palmyrenes abroad, western foreigners in Palmyra, comparative studies on Palmyrene religion in Palmyra and the West, transmission and transferal of ideas through art and architecture, Palmyrene presence in the region between Palmyra and the Mediterranean coast as well as cultural backflows between Palmyra and the West and vice versa.
