

Howard is an associate professor of counseling psychology and applied human development at Boston University Wheelock College of Education & Human Development, where she serves as director of training of the Counseling Psychology PhD Program. Dr. Siobhan Neary is Professor of Career Development Practice and Head of the International Centre for Guidance Studies (iCeGS), University of Derby. Siobhan leads a centre researching social justice with a specific emphasis on careers guidance, development, and transitions throughout the life course. Her research portfolio includes work on quality, career management, continuing professional development (CPD), professional identity, strategic workforce, and service developments with a range of organisations at regional, national, and international levels. She is a Fellow and Vice-Chair of the National Institute for Careers Education and Counselling (NICEC) which is an international learned society representing thought leadership within careers related research and is a Fellow of the Career Development Institute. She has recently co-chaired a Skills Commission inquiry resulting in the Transitions to Ambition: Navigating the Careers Maze Report.

Chong Myung Park Boston University

Dr. Chong Park is a Research Scientist in Counseling Psychology and Applied Human Development at Boston University. Her research, in collaboration with Prof. Dr. V. Scott Solberg, focuses on the examination of career development in K-12 and post-secondary settings, especially the programs and services for high risk, high opportunity youth populations. Jérôme Rossier University of Lausanne

Jérôme Rossier is currently vice-rector for Human Resources and Lifelong Learning and full professor of vocational and counseling psychology at the University of Lausanne. He is the past-editor of the *International Journal for Educational and Vocational Guidance* and member of several editorial boards. His teaching areas and research interests include counseling, personality, psychological assessment, and cross-cultural psychology. He published more than 200 scientific articles and book chapters and recently edited a handbook about *assessment in a multicultural and multilinguistic context*. He participated to many international research projects, such as the personality across culture research or the international career adaptability project.

Anna Dorota Bilon-Piórko is currently working as an associate professor at the University of Lower Silesia in Poland. Her research interests include career guidance and adult education as well. She is particularly interested in critical and comparative studies of career guidance policies and systems as well as combining career guidance and adult learning theories. Rationale

This year's ECADOC theme will focus on investigating the role of "deep human" skills and career readiness. "Deep human" skills are advanced social emotional learning skills. Historically, these skills have been referred to as soft or non-cognitive skills. With the 4th Industrial Revolution replacing so many job sectors with technology, employers are recognizing that what cannot replaced are interpersonal and complex communication skills, empathy, and leadership skills.

In this summer school, we will explore advanced social emotional learning skills as part of the environments that contribute to supporting students at different education levels, such as early childhood, secondary, and postsecondary education levels, and preparing them for the future labor market. We will discuss the projects that work to optimize youth educational and training opportunities, and the research methods used in investigating the project impact and examining youth experiences.

The design of this year's ECADOC Summer School was based on the work of Social and Emotional Learning International Research Network (SEL-IRN; officially recognized by the World Education Research Association) led by Drs. Lea Ferrari, Chong Park, and V. Scott Solberg. Since 2018, the SEL-IRN has been actively engaged in conducting research on the nature and value of Social and Emotional Learning in supporting youth future readiness by reflecting the voice of educators and valuing different perspectives across the Global South, Asia and the Global North. The network represents 20 countries around the globe that includes 35 researchers, ranging from seasoned to early career researchers to graduate students.
