



- Potato is a climate friendly crop
- EU wants to halve use of pesticides by 2030
- EU wants to increase organic production to 25% of arable land by 2030
- The potato chain is increasingly challenged in more productive regions
- Traditions and knowledge risk to disappear in less productive regions
