Pitch session with Isabella Righini (McS, Wageningen University & Research)

On the topic: **EUdamame - Advancing Edamame production for sustainable protein supply in Europe**

"Food production needs are evolving: consumers demand fresher, safer, more nutritious, and locally produced crops using fewer resources and at affordable prices. This trend also applies to protein products, with a shift from animal-based to plant-based proteins driven by health, climate change, and animal welfare concerns. Thus, there is a need for exploring new methods to produce fresh protein-rich crops for human consumption (with legumes as the main representatives), and increase their availability in Europe. Fresh soybean, or "Edamame" (Glycine max L.) is a key candidate due to its excellent nutritional and agronomic properties... Read more and find the recordings here

On the topic: Accelerating dietary FIBRE

Diversification and Research Innovation for Wellbeing in Europe

"The agenda on green transition of diets in Europe has focused a lot on protein. But there is a food component with an even bigger health potential: Dietary fibre. But dietary fibre is not just dietary fibre, there are many types, and each has different health and manufacturing properties. Today, food production generates huge waste streams, including material with many different types of dietary fibre. By developing methods to efficient extract dietary fibres from waste products, we can increase of raw food materials, reducing land use and produce fibre combinations to increase dietary fibre diversity in food products...
