




FINNISH TOP-8 POSITIONS AND POINTS IN OLYMPICS AND WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 2005-2016




MAIN ACHIEVEMENTS


- + The number of world-class training processes has increased

Suggested modification of strategy:


- + Simplification of strategic goals

CLARIFICATION OF ROLES, RESPONSIBILITIES AND TASKS

- + **Sport federations** are responsible for developing their own sport.
- + High Performance Unit leads and coordinates the elite sports network.
- + <u>Sport Academies and High Performance Centers</u> offer environments and facilities for sport federations, teams, and individuals.
- + <u>Olympic Sports Research Institute KIHU and Sports Medicine Centers</u> provide expertise and sport science.
- + <u>Local clubs</u> are responsible for involving children, organizing events, providing recreational activities and educating coaches at the local level.
- + Ministry of Education (and Sports) provides funding and political support (Sports Act)
- + State Sports Council follows, measures and evaluates Elite Sports in Finland

JOINT TARGETS, JOINT STRATEGY, JOINT RESOURCES



PERFORMANCE TARGETS 2017-2020

- + 10 Olympic medals
- + 10 Paralympic medals
- + Team sport qualifying to Tokyo 2020

Supportive targets:

- + Minimum of 30% increase in number of athletes with top 8 Olympic potential compared to 2014/2016 Olympics
- + Professional coaches for all the best athletes
- + Minimum of 25 % increase in number of full time Olympic coaches compared to 2017




KEY FACTORS

- + Optimised processes for top athletes coaching and training environments which are internationally competitive
- + Development of expertise is in all sectors
- + Development of leadership, co-operation and respect

1=weak, 2=satisfactory, 3=fair, 4=good, 5=excellent






FEEDBACK FROM THE OLYMPIC TEAM MEMBERS

FINLAND - ONE OF THE GREATEST SPORTING NATIONS

- + Participating at the Olympic Games since 1906:
 - + 312 medals in Summer Olympics, all-time 12th best nation
 - + 167 medals in Winter Olympics, all-time 7th best nation

- + Current success in international sports:
 - + Ranked 30th overall in 2017 by greatestsportingnation.com
 - + Ranked 13th per capita in 2017 by greatestsportingnation.com
