Environmental Ethics; Sustainability and the special case of The Arctic

Presentation by Post.doc Jacob Busch, Department of Culture and Society, Philosophy, Aarhus University.

In my talk I will discuss a traditional line taken by environmental ethicists, when it comes to discussing ethical themes relevant for the arctic region. In particular issues of sustainability, (environmental and cultural) and issues to do with what the relevant notion of value may be for having these kinds of discussions. In particular I will challenge the traditional view that species deserve our ethical regard simply in virtue of being valuable full stop (due to their intrinsic value). In contrast to this I will propose a preliminary exploration of what follows if we adopt a more anthropocentric line regarding this issue.

Jacob Busch is Post Doc at AU, with a PhD from the University of Auckland (2007). He works within the area of philosophy of science and has recently started working within the area of applied ethics.
